

#### **New Statewide & County Closures Related to Covid**

Effective immediately, California closed some indoor business operations statewide and additional indoor operations in several counties, including Orange County. Please click <a href="here">here</a> for the State information.

Statewide indoor closures include restaurants, bars and breweries, wineries and tasting rooms, movie theaters, family entertainment centers, zoos and museums, and cardrooms. County indoor closures include fitness centers, places of worship and cultural ceremonies, indoor protests, offices for non-critical infrastructure sectors, personal care services, hair salons and barbershops, and malls. The City has asked the County to gain better clarification on personal care services (hair salons, barber shops) as

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we are wanting to allow such services to set up outside. However, the State licensing board does not allow it to occur. We are hopeful they will change their guidance during this time and, if so, we will notify such businesses.

Although there are still several closures in place, there are steps businesses can take now to ensure when businesses reopen again that they stay open. Keep Fullerton safe by:

The City Council will also consider whether to put a ballot measure on the November 2020 election to prohibit safe and sane fireworks due to increased complaints.

Fullerton Municipal Code Amendment to Chapter 8.75 Regulating Sidewalk Vendors

Approval of this item will update the Fullerton Municipal Code to reflect current State law related to Sidewalk Vending.

## Monthly Legislative Update

The City Council will consider support/oppose positions from the Legislative Subcommittee as well as discuss those bills which were recommended for full City Council consideration.

## August 4, 2020 City Council Meeting Cancellation

Due to a limited amount of projected agenda items and the increase in COVID cases, it is recommended that the City Council cancel the August 4th meeting and consolidate items on the August 18th meeting.

## Consideration of a Vehicle Incentive Purchase program

The Mayor has requested that the City Council consider whether to proceed with a rebate style program for Fullerton residents or businesses purchasing new or used vehicles from major retailers in town if the sales tax measure put on the November ballot is successful. If approved, Staff would bring back a proposed program on August 18th.





# **Water Division Updates**

## Meter Shop

Meter Shop staff perform meter reading duties and respond to service calls during normal hours of operation and callouts after hours. In addition, they also turn water services on or off based on residents' needs, post water service accounts, replace water meters, water meter boxes/lids and perform repairs/tests on water meters.

#### **Water Production**

Staff perform a variety of field lab sampling as required by the State of California. This includes water samples from our wells, reservoirs and water distribution system. Control valves and plug valves regulate water between different pressure zones or elevations within the water system and require preventative maintenance (PM). Well production is a total of gallons produced from City water wells, and MWD production gallons reflect water purchased from Metropolitan Water District.

#### **Water Distribution**

This Division is responsible for the maintenance of the water transmission and distribution system that delivers water to City residents, businesses, and industries. The water transmission and distribution system consists of 430 miles of water pipeline, more than 31,500 metered services, 4,000 fire hydrants, and 12,000 valves. On an annual average, we respond to 4,600 underground service alert tickets.





# **Water Repair**

On July 8, 2020 a repair crew from the Water Construction Section replaced a water service located at 2807 Vandergrift Drive. The excavation was backfilled and compacted in preparation for the installation of permanent asphalt, and our Street Division installed hot asphalt on July 9.

Senior services during COVID-19 include: Meals on Wheels OC food distribution and home delivery, grocery box distribution, Senior Buddies Program in partnership with Fullerton Free, emergency feeding assistance, and regular wellness reassurance calls to our community members. Through our partnerships, we have been able to provide 8,858 seniors with food and other essential services.



We are excited to introduce our newest program to help keep our older adults entertained and engaged while isolating: Senior Art at Home Kits! The kits will be available bi-monthly, and each kit will focus on a new artist and theme. Our first kit will be available for pick-up on **Tuesday**, **July 28th from 1-3pm** and focuses on French artist, Henri Matisse. Throughout his career, Matisse searched for a way to unite the formal elements of color and line. As an older adult, he used two simple materials—white paper and gouache (a kind of watercolor paint) —to create works of wide-ranging color and complexity. A simple pair of scissors was the tool Matisse used to transform paper into a magical world of plants, animals, figures, and shapes. Our At Home Art kits will contain all the necessary materials to create a Matisse-inspired collage. The kits are free for seniors age 60 and over.







## Early Fullerton History

When Charles Chapman moved to Fullerton in 1898, there was no First Christian Church, and he had to attend services in Anaheim. In 1904 he purchased a lot at the northeast corner of Harbor and Wilshire, and erected Fullerton's third church building. The congregation used the

church until 1911, when it was moved to 115 E, Brookdale, where it now stands.
