

# CITY HALL & CITY SERVICES HOLIDAY CLOSURE

This year, the planned closure period for City Hall in accordance with Resolution 9197 will include the following days: City Hall will be closed Thursday, December 24, 2020, through Friday, January 1, 2021. City offices will re-open on Monday, January 4, 2021, as outlined below:



City business offices will be closed from close of business on December 23, 2020 through 7:00 a.m. January 4, 2021. The following closure days and holidays will be observed for most employee groups. (Winter closure days do not apply to the Police and Fire Departments, certain Community-oriented facilities, or building inspection operations.)

During the COVID-19 pandemic, the City Council and all City Commissions/Committees may conduct meetings via video conferencing, per exemptions allowed under the Governor's Executive Order N-29-20. All agendas can be found online by clicking <a href="mailto:here">here</a>. Comments on agenda items can be e-mailed before the meeting to <a href="mailto:cityclerksoffice@cityoffullerton.com">cityclerksoffice@cityoffullerton.com</a>. Council meetings are also broadcast live on <a href="mailto:Channel 3">Channel 3</a>, Facebook Live, and streamed online.

The City Council met on December 15th with Closed Session beginning at 4:00pm. The planned Study Session

ginning at 5:30pm, and Regular session beginning at 6:30pm and concluding at approximately 12:00am.

Rabbi Levi Blesofsky gave the invocation. Council Member Jung led the Pledge of Allegiance.

There was one report out from the City Attorney on Closed Session items. The City will join with the Orange County Water District and member agencies in a lawsuit against identified companies which produced or polluted the water supply related to PFAS chemicals. There were no presentations made.

Various e-comments were submitted regarding City issues, such as City Council Member rotation, homelessness, process for public comments, and alleged police officer misconduct.

There were approximately 15 public comments regarding City phone number prefixes, drive-in movies during pandemic, homelessness, alleged police officer misconduct, radiation levels, safe parking program, and application process for obtaining permits.

City Manager Ken Domer provided an update on the RV signs—ticketing only when signs are posted, but at this time no tickets are being issued. If signs are not posted for street sweeping, tickets will not be issued. Signage is being completed. Tickets for overnight parking and street sweeping are not being issued at this time due to the Governor's Stay-At-Home Order and will continue through the duration of the Order. In response to the Covid pandemic and also Cal OSHA regulations, City Hall is temporarily closed for in-person water payments. Payments can be placed in the utility payment box located outside of City Hall. City Council Meetings may continue to be held in the Community Center to allow for public participation. City Council Meetings will also be broadcast on a local FM radio and transmitted into the parking lot so persons can listen in the safety of their vehicle.



#### Consent Calendar Items:

The consent calendar was approved unanimously with the exception of Item #5, Workers' Compensation Alternative Dispute Resolution Program—Fullerton Firefighters' Association passed 4--0-1 (Dunlap abstained).

There were two (2) Public Hearing Items.

- Commercial Cannabis Fees Pursuant to City of Fullerton Ordinance No. 3289. On a 3-2 vote (Zahra and Silva opposed), this item will be continued to the March 16, 2021 City Council Meeting.
- Short-Term Rental Permit Fees. The resolution was adopted. This item passed unanimously.

#### Regular Business Items:

- Item #15: Urgency Ordinance To Stay Ordinance No. 3289 Pertaining To Regulation Of Commercial Cannabis Businesses Citywide. The item was discussed and on a 2-3 vote (Zahra, Jung, Silva opposed), the item failed. (Item heard before Public Hearing)
- Item #16: Request For Proposal for Police Towing Services—Re-Inspections of Pacific Towing And Hadley Tow Facilities And Vehicles. This item was discussed and passed unanimously.
- Item #17: CALPERS Reservation Of Right Letter. This item was discussed. On a vote of 2-3 (Zahra, Jung, Silva opposed), the item failed.
- Item #18: Fiscal Sustainability Plan Consulting Agreement. This item was discussed. On a vote of 2-3 (Whitaker, Dunlap, Jung opposed), the item failed.
- Item #19: Orange County Power Authority Board Appointment (continued from November 17, 2020). This item was discussed. On a vote of 3-2, Council Member Jung was elected as the Regular Board Member and Council Member Zahra was elected as the Alternate.
- Item #20: Professional Services Agreements With GovInvest, Inc. For Pension Liability, OPEB And Actuarial Services And Adastragov, Inc. For Labor Costing Technology. This item was discussed and passed 3-2 (Whitaker, Dunlap opposed).
- Item #21: Financial Consideration Of Proposed Side Letter To Memorandum Of Agreement Between City Of Fullerton And Fullerton Firefighters' Association. This item was discussed and passed 4-0-1 (Dunlap abstained).

# **Water Division Updates**

#### Meter Shop

Meter Shop staff perform meter reading duties and respond to service calls during normal hours of operation and callouts after hours. In addition, they also turn water services on or off based on residents' needs, post water service accounts, replace water meters, water meter boxes/lids and perform repairs/tests on water meters.

#### **Water Production**

Staff perform a variety of field lab sampling as required by the State of California. This includes water samples from our wells, reservoirs and water distribution system. Control valves and plug valves regulate water between different pressure zones or elevations within the water system and require preventative maintenance (PM). Well production is a total of gallons produced from City water wells, and MWD production gallons reflect water purchased from Metropolitan Water District.

#### Water Quality Specialist

The Water Quality Specialist monitors routine and main break bacteriological results and takes action if a positive sample is detected. Per California regulation, water services that present a hazard to the water supply are required to have a backflow prevention device to prevent polluted or contaminated water from entering the potable water system. These devices must be tested yearly to ensure they are in working order. The Water Quality Specialist is also responsible for water conservation complaints and assists in responding to billing disputes.

#### Water Distribution

This Division is responsible for the maintenance of the water transmission and distribution system that delivers water to City residents, businesses, and industries. The water transmission and distribution system consists of 430 miles of water pipeline, more than 31,500 metered services, 4,000 fire hydrants, and 12,000 valves. On an annual average, we respond to 4,600 underground service alert tickets.





Here's how it works: When you place items on hold, library employees will pull the available items from the shelves and process them for pickup. Once the hold becomes available, you will receive an automated notification by email or phone that the items are ready. You can also check your holds status online via your account at <a href="https://www.fullertonlibrary.org">www.fullertonlibrary.org</a> under the "Holds" tab in "My Account."

Once you have been notified that your items are ready, call the library Monday through Friday from 11:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. at (714) 738-6333 to make an appointment to pick them up. You will have 14 days from the time of notice to pick up your materials. (If you can't call, send us an email at <a href="mailto:info@fullertonlibrary.org">info@fullertonlibrary.org</a>.)

Due to high demand, the library requires a minimum of two to three full business days to process requests. (During this time there may also be a slight delay in our ability to reach out to you by email or phone.) We ask you to be patient as we work hard to fulfill your requests while taking extra precautions, including quarantining returned books for 96 hours, to ensure your safety.

Returns are not accepted during curbside pickup. To return your items, please use the outdoor book drop between Monday at 9:00 a.m. and Friday at 4:00 p.m.




