### Fullerton Fire Department Receives First Dose of Moderna COVID-19 Vaccine

The Fullerton Fire Department began receiving the Moderna vaccine Monday morning December 28, 2020 along with other Orange County Firefighters at three locations situated throughout the County. This process will be replicated again for the second dose in late January and early February. In addition, plans are in progress to enable Fullerton Firefighters/Paramedics to administer the vaccine to our community.

This is great news, but we want to encourage everyone to continue to wear a face covering, stay 6 feet apart from others and limit interactions with people outside your household. With your help we can stop the surge as COVID-19 is now pushing hospitals to the breaking point. Stay Home. Save Lives.

### County to Open Super-PODS for Vaccine Distribution

The County of Orange is working on securing agreements with sites that are adequately sized to reach a daily goal of 7,500 persons vaccinated. Ultimately, there could be up to 5 Super Point Of Distributions (POD) sites within the County. Following State guidelines, the County is using a phased approach to vaccinations and distribution will be increased over time and based on available supplies. Currently, the phased approach is geared towards vaccinating critical and healthcare workers, to include paramedics and front line police officers. Hospitals are distributing vaccines to their medical staffing and Walgreens and CVS hold contracts to assist in vaccinating those working at and residing in skilled nursing facilities. When Can I Get Vaccinated?

Phased Approach to Vaccine Distribution - Given the limited initial supply of COVID-19 vaccines, distribution will be limited at first and increase over time. Determinations will be based on reaching critical populations to reduce morbidity and mortality rates due to the transmission of COVID-19. Right now, the State of California is currently in Phase 1A, Critical and Healthcare Workers distribution. Below is a list of active vaccination tiers:

- Acute care, psychiatric and correctional
- Skilled nursing facilities, assisted living facilities, and similar settings for older or medically vulnerable individuals and residents in these settings
- Paramedics, Emergency Medical Technicians (EMTs) and others providing emergency medical services
- Dialysis centers
- Intermediate care facilities for persons who need non-continuous nursing supervision and supportive care
- Home health care and in-home supportive services
- Community health workers, including promotoras
- Public health field staff
- Primary Care clinics, including Federally Qualified Health Centers, Rural Health Centers, correctional facility clinics and urgent care clinics
- Specialty clinics
- Laboratory workers

### COVID-19 Small Business Loan

The first round of the California Small Business COVID-19 Relief Grant Program has been extended until Wednesday, January 13, 2021. Any small business or small nonprofit that applies must meet specific criteria to be eligible to receive a grant of up to \$25,000. If you are unable to meet the January 13, 2021 application deadline, do not worry. The State plans to announce a second round of loans. The second round date is yet to be determined. ### GRANT AMOUNTS

The amount of grant funding ranges from \$5,000 to \$25,000. Businesses are eligible based on their annual revenue as documented in their most recent tax return:

| Eligible Businesses Annual Revenue         | Grant Amount Available Per Business |
|--|-------------------------------------|
| \$1,000 to \$100,000                       | \$5,000                             |
| Greater than \$100,000 up to \$1,000,000   | \$15,000                            |
| Greater than \$1,000,000 up to \$2,500,000 | \$25,000                            |






### **Discover Fullerton on Foot:**



## NPDES & CITY OF FULLERTON'S EFFORT TOWARDS CLEAN WATER

Did you know that while sewer system goes to the treatment plant, urban runoffs (anything thrown, swept, poured into the streets, gutters or catch basins) flow untreated through the storm drain system directly into our channels, creeks and the oceans? To fulfill our promise of providing clean water for our residents, the City of Fullerton committed to the NPDES permitting program established as a result of the 1972 Clean Water Act.

### **What is NPDES?**

NPDES stands for National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System. It is a permit program created to address water pollution by regulating point sources that discharge pollutants to waters. The program gave EPA the authority to regulate discharges into our nation's waters by setting limits on the effluent that can be discharged into a body of water from an operating and permitted facility.




### **So why do you need to know about this program?**

Urban runoffs and storm water pollution contaminates the ocean, causes beach closures, and harms aquatic life. It can also clog gutters and catch basins, increasing the risk of flooding, and a wide range of public health problems. The City of Fullerton can provide our residents with Clean Water and enhance the quality of life using this program.

### **How has it changed the way we process wastewater?**

Cities and counties are regulated through permits issued by the Regional Water Quality Control Boards – City of Fullerton falls under Santa Ana Region jurisdiction. Since 1990, operators of large storm drain systems such as the City have been required to:

- Obtain a NPDES permit.
- Design a storm water management program to prevent harmful pollutants from being dumped or washed by storm water runoff into the system that discharges into local waterbodies.

Here's how it works: When you place items on hold, library employees will pull the available items from the shelves and process them for pickup. Once the hold becomes available, you will receive an automated notification by email or phone that the items are ready. You can also check your holds status online via your account at [www.fullertonlibrary.org](http://www.fullertonlibrary.org) under the "Holds" tab in "My Account."

Once you have been notified that your items are ready, call the library Monday through Friday from 11:00 [a.m.](#) to 4:00 p.m. at (714) 738-6333 to make an appointment to pick them up. You will have 14 days from the time of notice to pick up your materials. (If you can't call, send us an email at [info@fullertonlibrary.org](mailto:info@fullertonlibrary.org).)

Due to high demand, the library requires a minimum of two to three full business days to process requests. (During this time there may also be a slight delay in our ability to reach out to you by email or phone.) We ask you to be patient as we work hard to fulfill your requests while taking extra precautions, including quarantining returned books for 96 hours, to ensure your safety.

Returns are not accepted during curbside pickup. To return your items, please use the outdoor book drop between Monday at 9:00 a.m. and Friday at 4:00 p.m.

3. Search for items, then select the "place hold" button by the item(s) that you want to order.
4. Wait for an automated notification that your holds are ready to be scheduled for pickup. You can also check your 'Holds' status in your account online. To schedule, use the link in the notification email OR ...
5. Go to [www.fullertonlibrary.org](http://www.fullertonlibrary.org) to schedule your pickup time. (*Note: Not all holds may become available at the same time*)
6. At your scheduled time, come to the main entrance and ring the doorbell!
7. Take your items to go and enjoy!





Fullerton scored a major coup in 1957 when they convinced Hughes Aircraft to build a \$6 million plant on 476 acres north of Hunt Foods. Hughes was already operating in other SoCal locations, but Fullerton was selected over four other cities based on the “desirability of the city as a home for our Hughes’ employees.”
