COMMUNITY AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

BUILDING & SAFETY

- The division would like to welcome Priscilla Diaz, our new Permit Technician.
- The division has updated our enterprise permitting system and is implementing business process enhancements.
- We also have been awarded an \$80,000 grant from the CA Energy Commission for solar permit streamlining.
- The team is diligently working to improve our service delivery and reduce permit turnaround time through these combined efforts.
- Our inspectors are now utilizing iPads in the field for live inspection status changes.
- The online customer service EasyDev portal has been enhanced and expanded, as it is now available for all applicants to view permit status, plan check corrections, schedule permits, and see all the assigned inspections citywide every day.
- We are also currently hiring for a Building Inspector I, and are reviewing the candidate pool moving forward.



PLANNING UPDATES

The Planning Department is working with the City's consultants, Townsend Public Affairs, the City Attorney, and Fullerton Heritage to resolve some emerging issues within the zoning ordinance, particularly as it relates to Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs). More specifically, recent legislation at the state level and interpretation of ADU laws by the Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) has been creating some conflicts between property owners and the City's zoning ordinance. HCD's current ADU guidance is in conflict with current Fullerton zoning so the Planning department anticipates bringing forward amendments to the Planning Commission in the Summer.

•Work on the Housing Element Update continues between the City's two consultants, Rincon Consulting and DUDEK. At this time, DUDEK is collecting feedback from property owners regarding the creation of a Housing Incentive Overlay Zone (HIOZ) via an on-line survey. So far, feedback received has been positive in support of the creation of the HIOZ. DUDEK is also in the process of working on the related Environmental Impact Report (EIR) which will be guided by a Scoping Meeting this summer (date TBD). Relatedly, Rincon is finalizing the housing inventory list, which is a key document required for Housing Element Update (HEU). Additionally, Rincon is making progress on responding to HCD's correction list to the first draft of the HEU.

CODE ENFORCEMENT

On May 11, 2023, the Code Enforcement team abated four illegal cannabis businesses after an OC Superior Court judge issued abatement warrants for failure to comply with an independent Public Nuisance Hearing Officer Order to close. All four illegal businesses had just been abated and raided on May 9, 2023, by the California Cannabis Bureau but reopened the same day. With the assistance of the Building Division, Southern CA Edison, and PD, Code Enforcement Staff executed the court-ordered abatement warrants to close and Red-Tag illegal cannabis businesses operating at 1146 East Valencia Drive, 2005 Raymer Avenue Unit F, 1181 East Elm Avenue, and 279 East Imperial Highway. The Police Department was notified to advise that any person trespassing the Red Tag is subject to arrest. The buildings remain unoccupied and will remain Red Tagged until the property owner can obtain permits to restore the buildings. Code Enforcement staff will follow up to ensure any costs incurred by the City for such abatements will be recovered pursuant to the Fullerton Municipal Code.

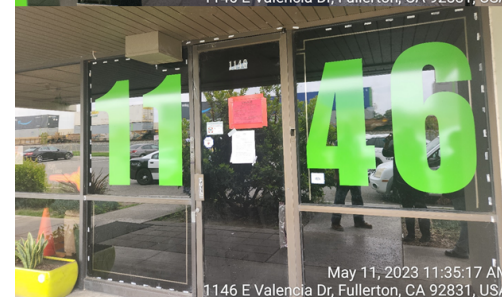
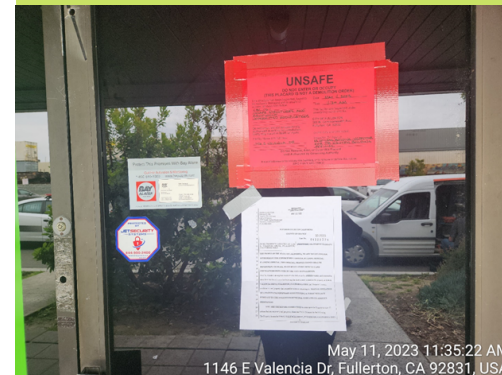

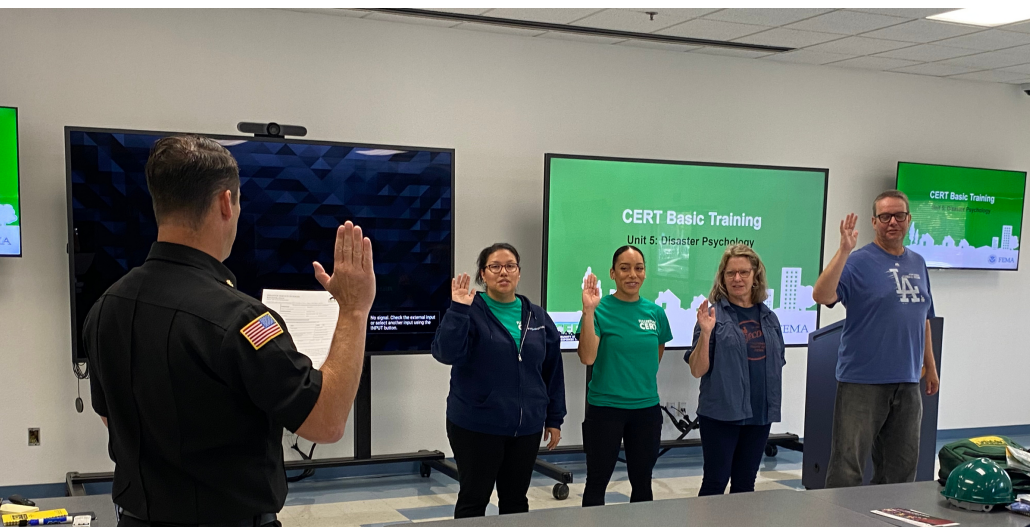


FIRE DEPARTMENT

CURRENT EVENTS

Fullerton Fire Department welcomes **Peter Salgado** as its new **Assistant Fire Marshal/Fire Plans Examiner**. The Assistant Fire Marshal (AFM) is responsible for maintaining the safety of Fullerton business owners and their customers along with the Firefighters who may respond to these locations. This highly technical position works collaboratively with the Community and Economic Development Department and the Public Works Department in processing the life safety aspect of plans for architects, developers, and local business owners and when the Fire Marshal is unavailable, will serve in this leadership capacity.

Fullerton Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) completed its first training and recertification class since COVID. CERT Volunteers complete an 18-hour training to volunteer with the program. Training includes an overview of local hazards, basic first aid, Stop the Bleed, light search and rescue techniques, fire behavior, how to use a fire extinguisher, and emotional and psychological first aid skills. CERT Volunteers are designated Disaster Service Workers. The goal for CERT Volunteers is to prevent and prepare for emergencies and disasters, assist during outreach events, and to be ambassadors of preparedness in the community.

RECRUITMENT SUMMARY

- A recruitment for **Administrative Analyst Series** was posted on March 22 and closed on April 16. 140 applications were received of which 65 took the written administrated on May 10.
- A recruitment for **Administrative Assistant I and Administrative Assistant – Confidential** was posted on February 15 and closed on March 5. 229 applications were received of which 132 were invited to participate in the written test administered on March 21 and March 24. 14 candidates were interviewed on April 12 and an eligible list was established on May 4.
- A recruitment for **Building Inspector I** was posted on March 1 and closed on March 26. 41 applications were received of which 9 were invited to interview on April 18. An eligible was established on April 19.
- A recruitment for **Construction Inspector** was posted on January 26 and closed on March 6. 25 applications were received of which 8 were interviewed on April 19. An eligible list was established on April 21.
- A recruitment for **Deputy City Clerk** was posted on April 17 and closed on May 7. 74 applications were received of which 6 will be invited to interviews on a date to be determined.
- A recruitment for **Director of Public Works** was posted on April 3 with an application review date of May 26. To date, 36 applications have been submitted.
- A recruitment for **Environmental Services Coordinator** was posted on January 27 and close on March 12. We received 42 applications of which 5 were invited to interview on April 18. An eligible list was established on April 18 and an appointment is pending.
- A recruitment for **Fiscal Operations Supervisor** was posted on February 10 and closed on March 26. 19 applications were received of which 4 were interviewed on May 15. An eligible list has been established.
- A recruitment for **Human Resources Technician** was posted on May 1 and is scheduled to close on June 4. To date, 143 applications have been received.
- A recruitment for **Maintenance Worker/Senior Maintenance Worker I** opened on January 11 as a continuous recruitment. The first round of the written test was administered on March 9. 35 candidates reported to the written test of which 18 passed and were placed on an eligible list. The next test is scheduled for May 18. Testing will be scheduled regularly until all vacancies for these positions are filled.
- A recruitment for **Parks and Recreation Coordinator** was posted on April 17 and closed of April 30. An eligible list has been established and an appointment is pending.
- In order to supplement an eligible list for **Permit Technician**, a second round of interviews were conducted on May 4 and an eligible list established on May 5.
- A recruitment for **Planning Technician** was posted on March 1 and closed on March 26. 47 applications were received of which 9 were invited to interview on April 12. An eligible was established on April 13.
- A recruitment for **Police Dispatcher** was posted on April 1 and closed on April 30. 59 applications were received of which 16 reported to a written test administered on May 18. Human Resources has already reposted the flyer and will be conducting continuous testing until all positions are filled.
- A recruitment for **Police Officer Trainee** was posted on March 27 and closed on April 16. A written test was administered on April 27 and the Physical Ability Test will be administered on May 19. A new recruitment has been posted and testing will be conducted on a continuous basis.
- A recruitment for **Police Services Representative** opened on January 4 and closed on January 29. 87 applications have been received. 14 candidates are being interviewed on May 24.

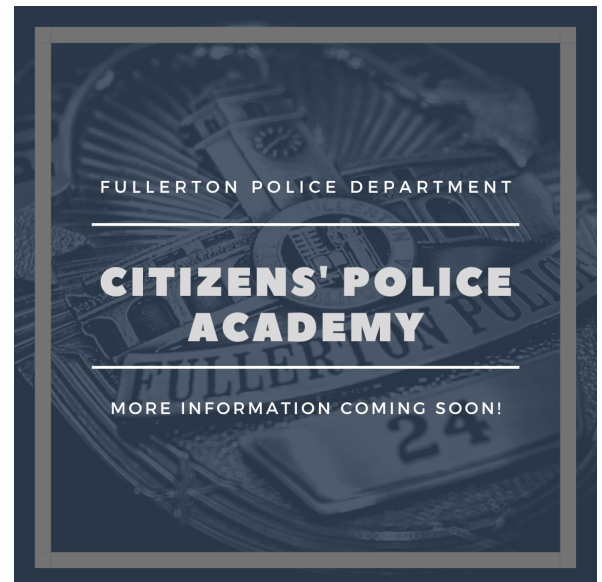


NEW MOTORCYCLES

PUBLIC WORKS

TREE PLANTING

In August 2020, the Public Works Department was awarded a grant from the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection (CAL Fire). One of the expected project outcomes is to plant 500 trees with a particular focus on increasing the tree canopy in disadvantaged communities in Fullerton. In the next 12 months, the Public Works Tree Division expects to plant 50 trees per month as part of our strategy to preserve our environment and regenerate our urban forest. A large portion of the funding for these trees will come from the CAL Fire grant. The first round of planting is scheduled to begin in the next couple of weeks.



SIFI UPDATE

SiFi's primary goal is to install as much fiber line as possible, regardless of compliance with issued permit conditions, City standards, public property, or public disposition. SiFi's contractors repeatedly fail to comply with the approved working hours by staying past the cut-off time of 5 pm. In addition, residents have expressed their frustration with SiFi's lack of advanced notification of construction activities. City staff continues to work with SiFi to try to minimize these inconveniences to our residents.

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

Serrano-Yermo-Via Caliente Area Street Rehabilitation

Street rehabilitation is now complete for a residential area in the northwest area of the City. Work involved repair of damaged curb and gutter, cross gutters, and sidewalk; installation of curb ramps; plus grind and overlay of approximately 0.6 miles of streets. The project was slightly delayed due to the recent storms, but it was completed on budget.



TRAFFIC ENGINEERING



Recently, there have been inquiries into the relevance of the City's early morning parking restriction ordinance. Residents have been vocal about the need and applicability of the restriction, given the current parking demands and growing population. Traffic Engineering Division and the Police Department Traffic Division are reviewing the conditions of the current ordinance and developing options to possibly modify the existing residential permit program or streamline and simplify the hardship exemption permit process. The options are planned to be presented to the Transportation and Circulation Commission for consideration in August 2023.
