Lateral FF/PM

For the first time, the Fullerton Fire Department opened a recruitment for lateral firefighters and paramedics. On boarding qualified and seasoned FF/PM's in tandem with the new firefighter recruit class (starting July, 17th) will enable the department to grow with purpose and intention. The application period closed with qualified applicants who are interested in joining FFD. The candidates must have a minimum of 12 months of continuous full-time professional employment as a Firefighter/Paramedic with a municipal fire department and a current California-issued Paramedic license. The lateral process was a collaborative effort between Fullerton Firefighters Association and City of Fullerton Human Resources.

Engineer Workshop

Fullerton Fire Department hosted an Engineer Training Workshop. The workshop supported prospective candidates who are qualified to promote to Engineer. The workshop included live drafting, a process which allows an engine to pull water directly from a reservoir. Hose lays, a predetermined hose length and pattern to support the rapid deployment of hose and water to extinguish a fire. It also included pump pressures, which ensure the right amount of water gets to the fire to expedite suppression on a fire. FFD has 8 qualified candidates who went through the workshop. Candidates who are in the testing process will complete a written test and practical test, and complete an oral interview panel.

RECRUITMENT SUMMARY

- A recruitment for **Building Inspector I** was posted on March 1 and closed on March 26. 41 applications were received of which 9 were invited to interview on April 18. An eligible was established on April 19. A second round of interviews were conducted on May 31. An appointment is pending.
- A recruitment for **Deputy City Clerk** was posted on April 17 and closed on May 7. 74 applications were received of which 6 were invited to interviews on June 2. An eligible list has been established.
- A recruitment for **Director of Public Works** was posted on April 3 and closed on June 14. 48 applications were received, with 13 currently under review by the Interim Director of Public Works and the City Manager.
- A promotional recruitment for **Fire Engineer** was posted on May 30 and closed on June 5. 7 applications were received. Testing will be concluded on June 15.
- A recruitment for **Firefighter/Paramedic Lateral** was posted on May 31 and is scheduled to close on June 18. To date, 11 applications have been received. This is the City's first time conducting a Lateral Firefighter/Paramedic recruitment.
- A recruitment for **Human Resources Technician** was posted on May 1 and closed on June 4.246 applications were received of which 104 have been invited to a written test scheduled for June 29.
- The recruitment for **Maintenance Worker/Senior Maintenance Worker I** is open as continuous. Testing has been conducted as follows:
 - o A test was administered on March 9 and an eligible list was established on March 21.
 - A test was administered on May 3 and an eligible list was established on May 5.
 - A test was administered on May 18 and the eligible list was established on the same date.
 - A test was administered on June 13.
 - A test is scheduled for June 17.
- The recruitment for **Police Dispatcher** is open as continuous. Testing has been conducted as follows:
 - o A test was administered on May 18 and the eligible list was established on was posted on May 30
 - A test was administered on June 9.
- The recruitment for **Police Officer Trainee** is open as continuous. The eligible list has been established as follows:
 - February 6, 2023
 - o May 1, 2023
 - o May 19, 2023
- A written test was administrated on May 25 with the Physical Ability Test scheduled for June 16.
- A recruitment for **Source Control Inspector** was posted on May 15 and closed on June 4.21 applications were received of which 8 will be invited to continue in the assessment process on a date to be determined.

PARK CAPITAL PROJECTS (CIP)

Union Pacific Park and Trail

Staff will be having a community meeting to get input from residents regarding Union Pacific Park and Trail. The meeting will occur on June 29th at 5:30pm at the Fullerton Community Center. The primary purpose of this meeting will be to get feedback from the community for the design of both the park and the trail.

With regard to the Union Pacific Trail, City Council previously directed staff to work on designs that incorporated a multi-modal trail that would go from Highland Avenue to Independence Park; this trail would be phase II of the Union Pacific Trail. Phase I of that trail, which goes from the Fullerton Transportation to Highland Avenue, was completed in 2003. Staff would like to present the designs for a multi-modal trail to the community before going back to City Council. Since a portion of the Union Pacific trail goes through Union Pacific Park, we will also be presenting the park design to the community for their feedback.

Independence Park

The Independence Park Improvement project was just approved for fiscal year 2024. The project includes installing a new fully accessible playground for ages 2 to 12 and moving it to the front of the park. The project is intended to consider a new location for a replacement skate park, the turf and parking lot areas, and removal of the racquetball building and nonfunctioning water feature. We contracted a landscape architect to begin the design process. Following the initial meeting with the landscape architect, in June or early July, we will conduct a community meeting to discuss the design of the park including the new playground.

The new playground will be in the first phase of construction. Playground installations typically take 8 to 12 months for design, engineering, manufacturing, and installation.

FPD ON TV




INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

Government agencies nationwide are being targeted by cybercriminals at an increasing rate. The City continues to receive numerous malicious emails designed to trick the recipient into clicking on a harmful link or attachment. At times, familiar entities that we do business with are impersonated, making it more difficult to see the potential danger.

What can we do to protect ourselves and our City?

- 1. Report any suspicious emails using the Phish Alert button in Outlook. Even if you plan delete the message, reporting it alerts our team to the danger and helps us detect and remove harmful messages from the mailboxes of other recipients. In May, 418 suspicious emails were reported. Nice work!
- 2. Take the monthly awareness training on your desktop computer or on the KnowBe4 mobile app. These short training sessions refine our skills and alert us of what to look for. In May, 63% of our staff completed the training. We would love to see that completion rate increase this month!
- 3. Inform IT right away if you clicked on a suspicious link or lost a device used for City work. We can isolate the device or account from the rest of our environment and reduce the impact of the attack.

Keeping our City safe involves all of us. Thank you for your continued partnership!
