### ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

#### PLANNING UPDATES

Kalaveras Mexican Restaurant at 124 E. Commonwealth (formerly Slide Bar) is constructing tenant improvements at this time. The owners of the restaurant are working with staff to correct unpermitted items from the previous operator, which includes removing an unpermitted stage. The owner is working to open the restaurant within the next several weeks with a proposed soft opening in early September.

We welcome them to the City of Fullerton!

Planning staff has accepted an **SB 330** application for a preliminary review of a proposed mixed development at the shopping center anchored by Target at the intersection of Yorba Linda Boulevard and Placentia Avenue. The proposal includes the expansion of the Target store, modifications to the exterior of the store, and construction of two residential developments providing approximately 500 units with some ground-floor retail space. The SB 330 process has several requirements which include a 30-day review period by the City and a 180-day applicant response period. The state-mandated process provides the applicant assurances as the City does not have the ability to incur new standards or fees as the applicant is "locked in" to the standards in place at that time.

#### BUILDING AND SAFETY

We are in the initial phase of implementation **SolarAPP**+ to streamline solar permits in compliance with Senate Bill 379.

#### Who is in your Crosswalk?

In partnership with Fullerton School District City of Fullerton departments have participated in a "Who's in your Crosswalk" safety campaign. #### **Trainees**

Fullerton Fire Department Fire Training Academy is still in session. Recruits had a unique training opportunity to train in CSUF Dorms which are going to be demolished. The recruits practiced hose lays using multiple entrance points, forceable entry, and ladder training. Putting skills into practice, in a real-world location and scenario, enables the recruits gain exposure to elements. We appreciate the partnership with CSUF and the ability to conduct training onsite.





## HUMAN RESOURCES

#### RECRUITMENT SUMMARY

- A recruitment for Director of Public Works was posted on April 3 and closed on June 14.48 applications
  were received, with 5 candidates being invited to continue in the process. Interviews are scheduled for
  August 11.
- A recruitment for Firefighter/Paramedic Lateral was posted on May 31 and closed on June 18. 14 applications were received. 8 candidates are scheduled to test starting on July 26. The eligible list was established on August 2. The Fire Department has sent four candidates to background.

# Summer Reading 2023 in the Children's Room Enjoyed by Hundreds of Kids

The children's Summer Reading Club ran from June 6 to August 5. A grand total of 853 participants joined the summer reading program this year, with 282 completing all of the offered activities, a record 33% percent finishing out the program. (Finishing the program meant reading an impressive 1,260 minutes! We also had 536 participants earn at least one prize.)

Our numbers for enrollment were down from last year, but had lots of engagement! Participants earned prizes and food coupons from our local supporters Pizza Heaven, Zombee Donuts, the Chapman Avenue McDonalds, Yogurtland, and Patty's Cakes and Desserts.

Even though Summer Reading for kids is over, our Summer Reading for Grown-Ups program is still ongoing until September 22—it takes longer to read those grown-up books!

#### • Acacia Park playground

- Playground has been designed and ordered and will be installed in October of 2023
- Site preparation is scheduled to begin in mid August

#### Chapman Park

- Scope of project includes ADA compliant restroom renovation
- o Project is currently in design phase
- Expected completion date: November 2023

#### Union Pacific Park

- Scope of project includes construction of a new park and demolition of remaining park equipment
- Staff is currently looking for funding sources
- Concept design to be reviewed by Parks and Rec commission in September

#### • Amerige Park Stadium Netting Project

- Scope of project includes raising safety netting along the south and west sides of the baseball field from 60 feet to 120 feet
- Once complete, the netting will significantly reduce the number of balls going over the net to the Fullerton Community Center and the parking lot
- o Construction began on August 7, 2023
- Expected completion date: August 2023

#### • Fullerton Golf Course Netting Project

- Scope of project includes extending safety netting between the driving range and fairway #1 at the Fullerton Golf Course
- American Golf is finalizing bids to select the netting contractor.



## FPD POLICE EXPLORERS - POST 204


Fullerton PD Police Explorers have been busy this summer with various events serving our community and learning more about law enforcement.

## INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

#### WATER MONITORING SYSTEM SECURITY UPGRADE

A security upgrade to the City's water monitoring system was recently completed. All SCADA-related hardware has been relocated to a more secure location. The SCADA network architecture has been enhanced with new hardware and routing to allow the system to be monitored remotely in a more secure manner. Also, two large displays with conferencing capabilities were installed to assist the water production office in monitoring treatment sites and training staff.

# PUBLIC WORKS

#### SOLID WASTE AND RECYCLING

The Public Works Department has developed a **Solid Waste and Recycling team** to manage all aspects of sustainable waste disposal and diversion operations while ensuring local and state legislative compliance. In the coming months, a focus on streamlining daily functionality, identifying opportunities for interdepartmental and regional collaboration, and community education and outreach initiatives will be prioritized.

Currently, the Solid Waste & Recycling Specialist, Michelle Keshishian, and the Environmental Services Coordinator, Olivia Martinez, have engaged in finalizing bimonthly and annual state reporting requirements, evaluating the City's compliance levels within existing state-mandated regulations, implementing feasible legislative program specifications while developing a plan of action for future compliance endeavors, and overseeing the City's Solid Waste Handling Services Agreement.

#### STREET SWEEPING UPDATE
