CITY OF FULLERTON EARNS TREE CITY USA DESIGNATION

The City of Fullerton has earned recognition as a **2023 Tree City USA!** The Tree City USA designation honors the City's commitment to effective urban forest management.



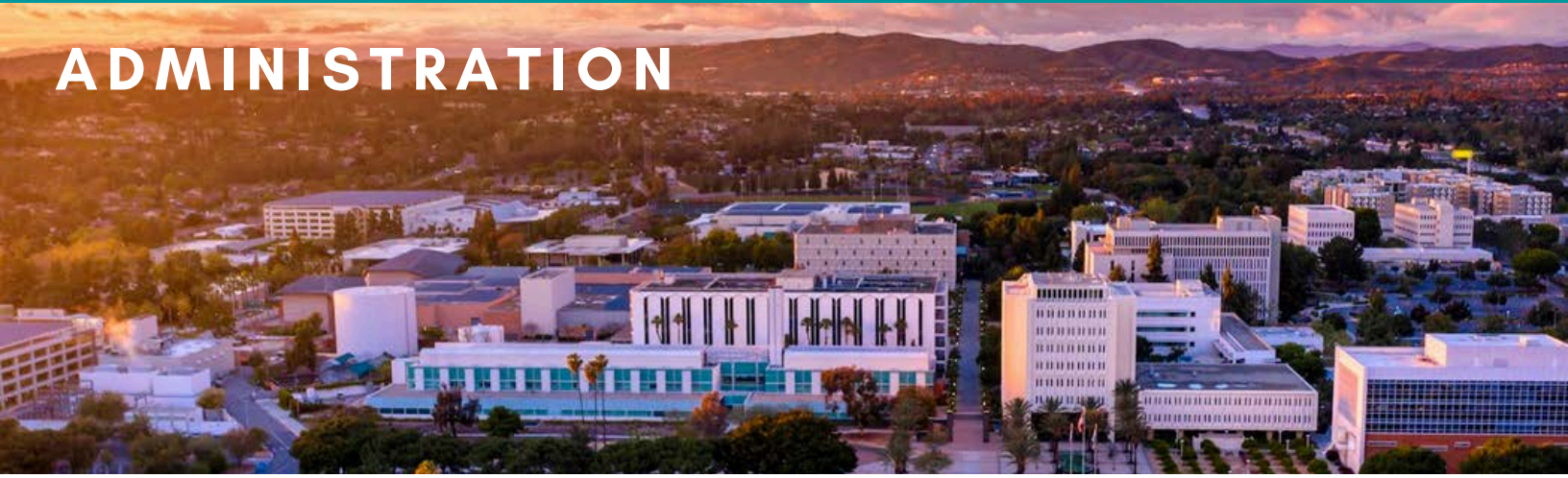
The City achieved the Tree City USA recognition for meeting the program's four requirements, which include maintaining a tree board or department, having a tree-care Ordinance, dedicating an annual community forestry budget of at least \$2 per capita, and hosting an Arbor Day observance and proclamation.

The program is sponsored by the Arbor Day Foundation, in partnership with the U.S. Forest Service and National Association of State Foresters. Through this partnership, their organizations aim to inspire communities to plant trees, properly care for trees, and celebrate trees. Trees are valuable assets in our communities due to the many benefits they provide, including providing cleaner air, providing wildlife habitats, reducing home cooling costs, and improving the aesthetics in our neighborhoods. By becoming a Tree City USA, Fullerton joins a dedicated network of more than 3,600 Tree City USA communities nationwide.

OC ANIMAL CARE MEETING RECAP AND NEW FULLERTON VACCINE CLINICS

At the last OC Animal Care meeting, the new Director was welcomed and provided updates on recruitments, an upcoming Foster-to-Adopt Pilot Program, and provided budget updates for the Fiscal Year (FY) 2023-24 budget and the upcoming FY 2024-25 budget.



OC Animal Care staff also discussed baby season being upon us, which means there is an increase in kittens, baby birds, and other animals. Information was provided for staff to relay to the public on OC Animal Care's role with sick and injured wildlife.

Mobile Vaccine Clinics

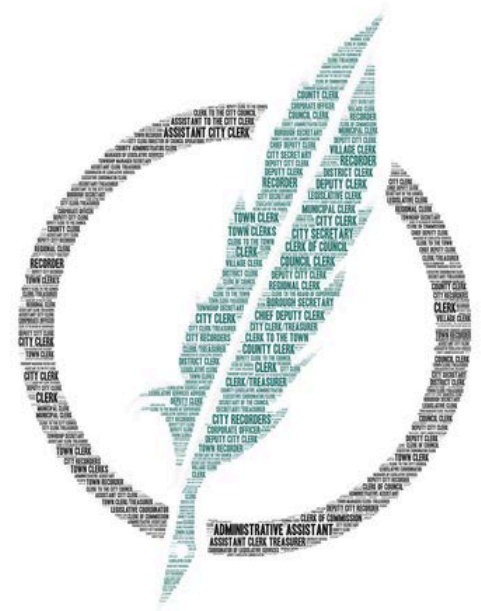

In April, the Housing Division finalized two renewals for Tenant Based Rental Assistance (TBRA). Additionally, they processed one new application and granted assistance to a new client living at Rancho La Paz. The assistance will take effect in May 2024.

There is growing interest in forming a new preservation district for the area identified as the Upper Golden Hill neighborhood. This neighborhood includes homes on Fern Drive, Valley View Drive, Wood Avenue, Lois Lane, and Grandview Avenue. The area is identified in the Fullerton Plan (i.e. General Plan) as a Potential Landmark District.

WILDFIRE READY!

As wildfire season approaches, Fullerton Fire Department is taking proactive measures to ensure our readiness and ability to respond effectively within Orange County and the State. Fire season is year round and warm, dry weather increases the risk of wildfires. Our crews have been diligently trained in new systems and procedures to enhance our wildland firefighting capabilities, including those pertaining to our State assigned OES-1313 brush engine. This Type 3 engine is equipped with 4X4 capability to access remote areas where wildfires often ignite and spread, allowing us to swiftly respond to emerging threats. In addition to training, we've equipped this team with cutting-edge resources, such as the Self Supporting Port-A-Tank. This deployable water tank can hold 1,500 gallons of water and is continuously monitored and replenished by water tenders ensuring there is a constant water supply for fighting remote fires.

Fullerton Fire Department supports the OC Office of Emergency Services (OES) strike team which includes OES-1313 for the prepositioning and deploying of critical fire resources in Fullerton High Fire Severity Zones, in Orange County, and throughout the Western United States. As we brace ourselves for the challenges of wildfire season, Fullerton Fire Department is ready to respond!

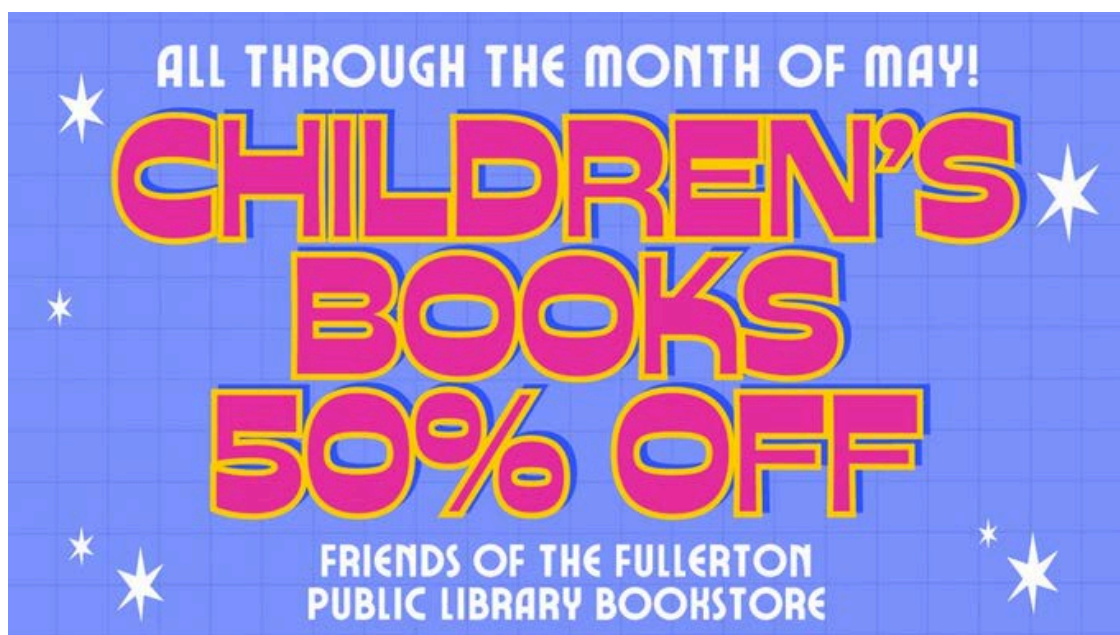
FASHIONABLE TEENS SCORE BIG AT CLOTHING SWAP!

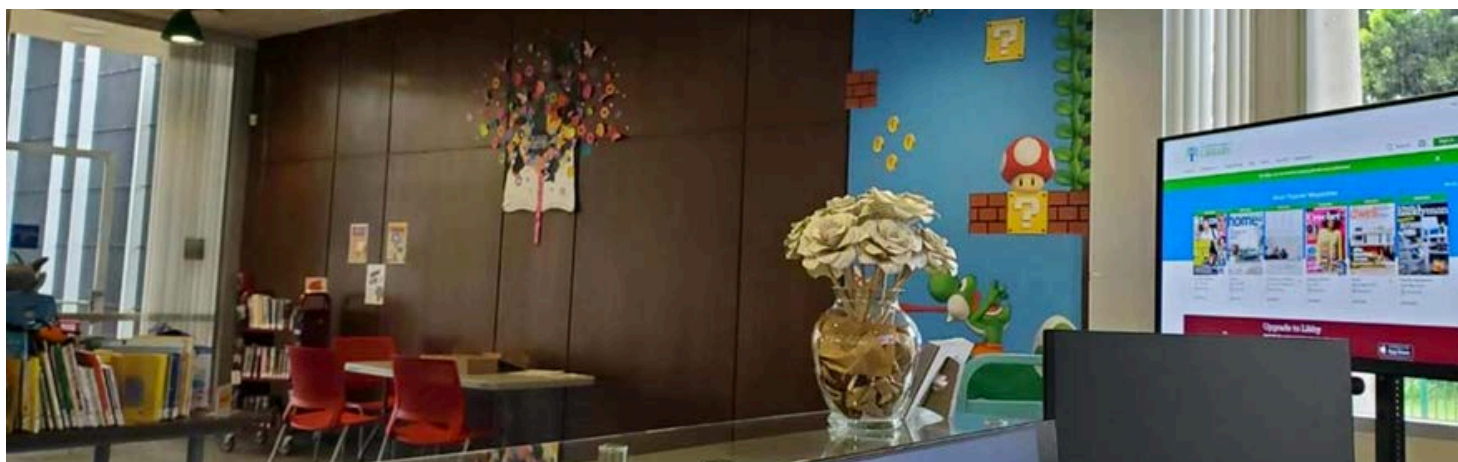


HUNT LIBRARY CELEBRATES REOPENING SUCCESS!

POLICE SERVICES REPRESENTATIVES

The Fullerton Police Department is constantly looking for ways to enhance our service to the public we serve. Beginning in October of 2023, we designed a position to address this specific need. The position was named Police Service Representative (PSR). The duties of a Police Service Representative include, burglary/theft investigations, stolen vehicle reports, storing/impounding vehicles, crime scene investigations, traffic collision reports, and parking citations. Since the beginning of this program, we have hired and successfully trained five new employees.



The addition of this position has allowed officers to be available for crimes in progress and place a stronger emphasis of crime prevention. This position may be the future gateway to a very successful career as a Police Officer or a Civilian employee position.

MOTORCYCLE SAFETY MONTH

On April 4, 2024, one of Fullerton PD's Motor Officers was involved in a traffic collision after a driver suddenly turned in front of the officer. Upon colliding with the sedan, the officer was thrown over the vehicle and knocked unconscious. The officer was transported to a local hospital with moderate injuries. Thankfully, the officer is expected to make a full recovery and has since returned to work on light duty.

SEWER DIVISION

Highlighted below is a crucial intervention by our sewer maintenance team.

During routine inspection, our camera crew discovered a significant root mass obstructing a sewer main, posing an imminent risk. Swift action was taken to mitigate this potential hazard, preventing a sewer overflow, and safeguarding public health. Through proactive monitoring and decisive response, we effectively averted a crisis, underscoring the importance of regular maintenance in our city's infrastructure.

This incident serves as a testament to the dedication and expertise of our staff in ensuring the functionality and resilience of our sewer system. During the month of April, our Sewer staff hydro jetted 32 miles of sewer main, used CCTV to inspect 29,895 feet of sewer main, and mechanically cleaned 313 sewer laterals.





PUBLIC WORKS

ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES BEVERAGE CONTAINER RECYCLING CITY/COUNTY PAYMENT PROGRAM

The Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) administers an annual program to provide opportunities for beverage container recycling and litter cleanup activities. CalRecycle is distributing \$10,500,000 in fiscal year 2023-24 to eligible cities and counties specifically for these endeavors.



The City's Solid Waste and Recycling Specialist submitted an application for the Beverage Container Recycling City/County Payment Program current round of funding. The eligible grant funds for the City of Fullerton were noted to be \$36,033. City staff was notified of the award on April 19, 2024 and funds are expected to be received sometime in spring 2024.

The Environmental Services staff have budgeted the amount primarily for the Phase II Centralized Waste Collection Program to continue to implement indoor and possible outdoor three-stream containers for trash, recycling, and organic waste collection within additional City facilities such as the Police and Fire Departments, Hunt Branch Library, and Fullerton Community Center.
