#### OC MEDIA LANDSCAPE EVENT




Forum's Staff attended  $\circ$ "Critical recently Conversations: OC Media Landscape" event in Irvine, which brought together key figures in the media industry to discuss the evolving landscape of media in Orange County. The event, moderated by Lizz Mishreki, Vice President of Communications at the Orange County Business Council (OCBC), featured a panel of distinguished speakers including Gustavo Arellano, a columnist for the Los Angeles Times; Ashley Alvarado, Vice President of Community Engagement & Strategic Initiatives at LAist; Harmonson, Senior Editor of the OC Register; and Rick Reiff, Editor at Large for the OC Business Journal.

The discussion focused on the generational shift in media consumption, the impact of digital platforms, and the future of local news in Orange County. Panelists explored both the challenges and opportunities presented by the rapid changes in how news is disseminated and consumed. Topics included the role of social media, the importance of community engagement, and the economic realities facing traditional media outlets.

Overall, the "Critical Conversations: OC Media Landscape" event served as a valuable platform for City staff to gain knowledge, build relationships, and adopt innovative strategies for improving public information and community outreach.

#### TYLER MUNIS UTILITY BILLING AND UTILITY SERVICES CASHIERING NOW LIVE!

On May 13, 2024, Tyler Munis Utility Billing and Tyler Cashiering for Utility Services launched in production. This major system transition introduced many new features benefiting both USD and Fullerton citizens, including:

- New customer-facing bills with easy-to-read consumption graphs.
- A new Customer Self-Service Portal with access to historic bills, consumption history, and a user-friendly self-payment process.
- An automated phone payment system for Utility Billing customers, available 24/7, for easy payment anytime, anywhere.
- Opt-in SMS text notifications and emails for city-wide announcements or notices related to Utility Services.



The Utility Services Department is currently working through billing all new and existing customers through this system. They have been accepting payments on previous bills through the new in-person cashiering system, automated phone payment system, as well as the new customer self-service portal.

The new Tyler Munis Customer Self-Service Portal and a newly dedicated Automated Phone Payment number will also be made available to General Billing customers in July.

Additional departments across the City will be transitioning to the new Tyler Cashiering platform over the next several months.

#### HOUSING



We're excited to announce that the previously city-owned property at 1600 W Commonwealth has officially been sold to Meta Housing for a 100% affordable housing project. This marks a significant milestone in our commitment to providing accessible housing options for all residents. Approved by the City in May 2023 and with the disposition and sale completed on May 29, 2024, this 65-unit development represents a crucial step forward in addressing our community's housing needs. With construction set to begin soon, we extend our heartfelt gratitude to all who contributed to making this project a reality, and we eagerly anticipate creating a more inclusive Fullerton for everyone.

#### PLANNING

- The Draft Environmental Impact Report (EIR) for the proposed Housing Incentive Overlay Zone (HIOZ) is available on the City website for a 45-day public review period starting on May 31, 2024. Notices were sent via US mail, email, and advertised in the Fullerton Observer. The EIR process was started in September 2023 with a Scoping Meeting and only covers the HIOZ portion of the Housing Element Update. Since no zone changes are proposed for the Housing Element, no EIR is required for that process.
- Planning staff and the City's consultants are actively working on corrections to the Housing Element Update in response to the comment letter provided by the Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) on May 9, 2024. Staff will post the revised Housing Element to the City website on June 19, 2024 for a 7-day public review period.

#### CODE ENFORCEMENT

As a follow-up to the May 14, 2024, Public Nuisance Hearing, the Independent Public Nuisance Hearing Officer issued his Order last week. In his order, he declared the site at 504 South Harbor a public nuisance and ordered the closure of the illegal business. City Staff served the property and business owners with the Public Nuisance Administrative Hearing Order and posted the property.

The Cannabis Code Enforcement Officer will inspect this week to verify compliance with the order. If the owners fail to comply with any of the requirements on the Order, staff will go to court to petition for an abatement warrant authorizing the City to execute the Public Nuisance Administrative Hearing Order. Any costs incurred by the City for such abatement will be recovered. Before June 15, 2024, Code Enforcement anticipates being able to close two illegal cannabis businesses, as the City was also granted another abatement warrant that staff applied for last week.






# FREE MOVIES ARE BACK AT THE FULLERTON PUBLIC LIBRARY WITH THREE NEW FILM SERIES!





My family thanks you from the bottom of our hearts and we cannot thank you enough for your courage and bravery!! You are my hero!!!!

I'm just so grateful that if it wasn't for him, my daughter never would have made it to the hospital that night, she would have been going to the morgue. I cry about that every day, and they are tears of joy because officer Peterson cared so much to help a stranger in need on his own time and I will always remember that.

#### STREET REHABILITATION PROJECTS

Rehabilitation of six residential streets was recently completed after a separate project replaced the water main in all the streets. In addition to the paving rehabilitation, the projects included repair of damaged curb, gutter and sidewalk, construction of ADA curb ramps, and minor repair of sewer pipes and manholes. The streets are Hillsboro Place, Norby Lane, Stephens Avenue, Peppertree Lane, Shadow Lane, and Sheppard Drive.

Summer will be a busy time for street improvements with Valencia Mesa Drive, Costa Court Area, Las Palmas Area, Hermosa Area, Pavement Treatment Project, Slurry Seal, and Orangethorpe Avenue all scheduled to start construction. In addition, a joint project with City of Placentia will repave Placentia Avenue from Orangethorpe Avenue to Chapman Avenue.



#### BASTANCHURY ROAD WIDENING

Staff is working to restart the design to widen Bastanchury Road at the Brea Creek Channel, adjacent to the Fullerton Golf Course. The City has a roadway easement in this area from the United States Army Corps of Engineers (ACE), therefore all design, environmental and construction must be approved by ACE. The improvements will include roadway widening to provide three lanes in each direction, Class I bicycle lane on the south side, new drainage facilities, repair and restoration of the Brea Creek Channel culvert outflow, and new retaining walls. The approval process is expected to take several years as ACE has very long environmental and design review schedules and other project priorities. The intent is to obtain design approval and then apply for Measure M2 Project O construction funding.



# EQUIPMENT FLEET & ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES UPDATE ADVANCED CLEAN FLEET REGULATION

Complying with the California Air Resources Board (CARB) Advanced Clean Fleet (ACF) Regulation for State and Local Agencies, the City recently purchased one F-150 lightning truck and two Mach E passenger vehicles. Both of these vehicles have a range of over 300 miles on a single charge. By the year 2027, all fleet purchases will be required to convert to all electric vehicles.

On April 28, 2023, CARB approved the ACF regulation as part of a larger strategy to accelerate a largescale transition to zeroemission medium— and heavy—duty vehicles towards achieving a statewide zero—emission truck and bus fleet by 2045.

The regulation went into effect on January 1, 2024. The City of Fullerton is one of the cities spearheading compliance methods in partnership with the California League of Cities Orange County Division.

In preparation of the transition, a select group of the City's Public Works Maintenance Yard staff attended the Enterprise Fleet Management Clean Air Trade Show to learn more about the Electric Vehicle industry, available technologies, and product offerings.

City staff is continuing to find avenues to implement the requirements through individual and collaborative grant opportunities, infrastructure planning, and future zero emission vehicle acquisition.
